On completing his schooling in Maputo, Moreira attended the University of Cape Town to further his music studies, graduating from the South African College of Music with a degree in jazz performance (1998) which he followed with an honours degree in Ethnomusicology (cum laude) (1999)

1. SOUNDS OF PEACE (2022)

Mixing influences from his Mozambican heritage with a sensibility that spans groove, soul, world music, smooth and contemporary jazz, Moreira has infused this new album with personal experiences from the past few years making Sounds of Peace a thought provoking, reflective and introspective album which never loses sight of the joy of jazz. Recorded at Friends Studio Mozambique, Maputo and mixed and mastered at Milestone studios in Cape Town South Africa.

2. M & M: MOREIRA CHONGUIÇA and MANU DIBANGO (2017)

After performing at the Morejazz Series in Maputo, Mozambique with his band, Manu spoke to Moreira about doing an album of evergreen jazz standards. *M & M* is that album. Recorded at Ferber Studios in Paris, France, and mastered in Cape Town, South Africa – this collaboration is a way of reviving great well-known music and interpreting it from an African perspective.

3. MOREIRA CHONGUIÇA – LIVE AT POLANA SERENA HOTEL (2015)

Recorded live at The Polana Hotel, Maputo, during the *MoreJazz Series 4* concerts in August 2014, this album features Tlale Makhene, Ernest Dawkins and Isabel Novella.

4. SENSASONS (2014)

This is the end product of a very successful project run with various agencies to highlight HIV/Aids awareness amongst the youth in Mozambique. The lyrics were prose and poetry written by school children and the music was written and performed by Moreira and young musicians from Maputo.

5. MP: RELOADED (2013)

This album is a remix of nine songs from *The Moreira Project Vol. 1 – The Journey* and *The Moreira Project Vol. 2 – Citizen of the World*. Having played with many DJ's in South Africa, Moreira was interested in adding beats to his jazz music and seeing the results. The album was mixed at Paris Studios by Paris Zannos and Moreira Chonguica and mastered at Milestone Studios by Murray Anderson.

Winner of BEST AFRICAN ALBUM by Just Plain Folks Music Awards in the USA.

6. KHANIMAMBO – MOREIRA CHONGUIÇA HOMENAGEIA LENDAS DE MOXAMBIQUE VOL. 1 (2011) (MOREIRA CHONGUIÇA PAYS TRIBUTE TO THE LEGENDS OF MOZAMBIQUE VOL. 1)

This album is a mixture of traditional Mozambican sounds, rock, ballads and jazz with unsolicited commentary in-between most of the tracks by the artists themselves. The 10 featured artists on the album are all from different parts of Mozambique. Each artist sings in his or her mother tongue, introducing themselves at the beginning of each song. The instrumentalists were all from Cape Town. Moreira arranged all the songs and plays on a number of the tracks. The album was mixed at Paris Studios by Paris Zannos and Moreira Chonguica and mastered at Milestone Studios by Murray Anderson.

This album was nominated for two SOUTH AFRICAN MUSIC AWARDS (SAMA) for BEST ENGINEER and BEST AFRICAN ADULT ALBUM

This album was produced by Moreira and honours these Mozambican musicians.

7. THE MOREIRA PROJECT VOL. 2 – CITIZEN OF THE WORLD (2009)

Moreira is a prolific researcher and is fascinated by traditional music from different parts of the world. Some examples of samples that he has collected can be found in this, his second album *The Moreira Project Vol. 2 – Citizen of The World* that was released in October 2008. The album features some of the finest talents in the industry, all who have contributed and added their unique sounds and passion to create an exceptional product. These include Lion of Africa – Manu Dibango, top American smooth-jazz artist, Najee, up and coming hip hop artist, Simba and well-known Mozambican/South African vocalist Jaco Maria.

The album was mixed in Cape Town and mastered by Phillipe Brun in Paris, France.

8. THE MOREIRA PROJECT VOL. 1 – THE JOURNEY (2006)

Moreira's debut album, *The Moreira Project Vol. 1 – The Journey* was released in January 2006 and received an overwhelming response from the industry, as well as the media both locally and internationally. The album expresses not only his phenomenal song writing ability and energetic performances, but also his major personal coup in securing the support and talent of international jazz legend Najee on several tracks.

The album specialises in contemporary African fusion jazz and was recorded by Moreira's own independent recording label, MoreStar Entertainment (Pty) Ltd. Produced by Mark Fransman and

Moreira, the album created a new awakening in jazz lovers as well as capturing a niche for the "fresh ear".

In 2007, *The Moreira Project Vol. 1 – The Journey* was nominated for three SOUTH AFRICA MUSIC AWARDS (SAMA) for BEST INSTRUMENTAL ALBUM, BEST CONTEMPORARY JAZZ ALBUM and BEST PRODUCER for Moreira Chonguiça and co-producer Mark Fransman.

WINNER: BEST PRODUCER

An honour and acknowledgement for a debut album produced by an independent record label.

COMMUNITY WORK/SOCIAL RESPONSIBILITY PARTNERSHIPS

Moreira is strongly involved in the promotion of education.

When his first album was launched in his hometown of Maputo, he contributed to start a campaign to renovate the Escola Nacional de Musica (National School of Music), the school he attended as a youth.

He regularly makes time at the school, conducting workshops and involving the children in corporate functions he may be booked for. As Patron, he sees his role as a facilitator and has facilitated for the director of the school to work at an outreach programme at Tete, near Cahora Bassa.

He has been involved with the United Nations HIV/Aids agency in Maputo and wrote a song for World Aids Day in 2009 that was performed for the President of Mozambique, Armando Guebuza at the opening of the All African Games in September 2011.

In 2010, with assistance from a Brazilian film crew, a video was produced of the song. In 2012, together with the John Hopkins University agency in Mozambique, Moreira as patron of a project called SensaSons, called for students to write poetry and prose about HIV/Aids. The authors of the Top 10 pieces chosen, were each given a small library of books from BCI, as well as having

their pieces put to music by musicians chosen by Moreira. A concert was held with all the winners and the artists involved in March 2013. The songs were released on CD in 2014.

Moreira is also involved with the Central Prison of Maputo's music programme where he encourages the inmates to use music as a vehicle of reform.

He works with the Ministry of Defence's Musical programme and Military band as well as the Ministry of Police.

In 2014 Moreira founded the Morejazz Big Band, which take 20 young people from his music school and teaches them the rudimental skills of performing in a big band scenario. Their first performances were as the opening act of the Morejazz Series and since then they have become a regular feature at events in and around Maputo.

In 2018 through his association with Grupo Entrepasto, he worked on spreading the message of road safety and the benefits of family planning.

March 2020 – Saw The Morejazz Big Band and JICA team take part in a Cultural Exchange Programme to expose and educate the children of the Aacosida Orphanage to music from Japan and Mozambique.

In 2021 – As Patron of the Aacosida Orphanage (Association of Friends of Orphaned Children with Aids), he collaborates and exchanges experiences with the 79 orphaned children under the care of Mr Macamo, and in October facilitated a financial agreement between the orphanage and the Japanese embassy for support valued at over \$25,000.00.

In 2023 – CULTURAL EXODUS PROJECT was the inaugural project by the newly formed MOREIRA CHONGUIÇA FOUNDATION seeking to empower and uplift Mozambican youth in particular in Cabo Delgado affected by terrorism

PRODUCER ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Apart from producing all his own albums *The Moreira Project Vol. 1 – The Journey*, Vol. 2 – *Citizen of the World*, *Khanimambo*, *MP Reloaded*, *Moreira Chonguiça live at the Polana Serena hotel*, *Sensasons*, *M&M and Sounds of Peace*, Moreira has also produced to two top African singers namely AFRIKKANITHA (from Angola) – *Ainda Sonho* (2 songs) and SIMPIWE DANA (South Africa) – *Kulture Noir* (3 songs)

Moreira has also produced the opening sequences for conferences MOZFO 2018 and the International Conference on Nature Based Tourism in 2018.

He was appointed to produce all the entertainment segments at the US/AFRICA Summit held in Maputo in June 2019.

In March 2020, he was appointed by the Namibian government to produce a cultural insert for the Presidential inauguration held in Windhoek.

In February 2022, he was appointed by the Mozambican government to produce the cultural opening for Mozambique Day at the World Expo, Dubai 2020

ADDITIONAL ACCOLADES

In 2000 Moreira was chosen by City of Chicago to be part of the Cultural Exchange programme co-ordinated by Ernest Dawkins alongside a select few other South African musicians.

In 2002, he was runner-up in the annual Adcock Ingram Jazz Competition run through UCT.

In September 2009, Moreira was invited to play in Rio de Janeiro as the only African on the show honouring Brazilian maestro Silvio Barbato, who was tragically killed on the Air France plane that crashed in the ocean in May 2009. Since then Moreira has made a number of trips to Rio and Brazil for various events and concerts. He has also conducted a master class at the University of Brazilia.

2009 – Moreira was included in the list by Jornal Noticias of Mozambique as the Best of 2009 together with President Guebuza and the Mambas (Mozambican Football Team).

2009 - Moreira was also elected Cultural Personality of 2009 by Radio Moçambique.

In November 2010, Moreira was invited to attend the inaugural African Leaders Network conference in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, as an inaugural member alongside top business and financial leaders of the African continent.

In November 2012, Moreira was invited to attend the 5th Entertainment and Education Conference in New Delhi to present his SensaSon project of which he is a patron, along with John Hopkins University. This project aims to bring awareness to youth through inviting them to write about themselves and their views on HIV/Aids through poetry and prose which will be put to music.

July 2012 – Moreira was appointed as a member of committee advising the Minister of Culture of Mozambique.

2013 – Moreira was awarded the seal of MADE IN MOZAMBIQUE – the first individual to be presented with this accolade.

2013/2014 – Moreira attended a number of world conferences, both as a performer and as a participant.

2014 – Moreira was voted Cultural Personality of the Year by the journalists of Mozambique's largest daily newspaper, *Noticias*.

2015, 2016 and 2018 – Moreira was awarded SUPERBRAND status – the first individual in Mozambique to be awarded this accolade.

2016 – Moreira was awarded the ORDER OF MERIT by His Excellency, Dr Marcelo Rebelo de Sousa, President of Portugal, for his contribution to jazz music in Mozambique.

2016 – The album *Live at Polana Serena Hotel* was nominated by AFRIMA (All African Music Awards) in the category of BEST AFRICAN ALBUM.

2017 – Moreira was voted Cultural Personality of the Year by the journalists of *Noticias* for a second time.

2017 – Moreira was voted Cultural Personality of the Year by national broadcaster Radio Moçambique.

2017 – The album *M & M: Moreira Chonguica & Manu Dibango* was nominated by AFRIMA (All African Music Awards) in the category of BEST AFRICAN ALBUM

2018 – Moreira was invited to be a member of the Kenjin-Tatsujin International Advisory Council representing Moçambique by Ashinaga, Japan. The purpose of the Ashinaga initiative is to provide education to orphaned African children.

2018 – Appointed by the province of Cabo Delgado as Patron of Cultural Tourism as a promoter for investment

2018 – Official opening of VIVO Bar and Lounge by Moreira Chonguica signature venue within the Radisson Blu, Maputo, Mozambique

2019 – Moreira was presented with the Medal of Merit: Arts and Letters from the Governor of City of Maputo on behalf of the Mozambican Government for his contribution to this field in Mozambique.

2019 – Invited by UNESCO to attend the International Jazz Day celebrations in Addis Ababa including performing with Dr Mulatu Astatke and the opening of the conference on World Press Freedom Day at the African Union Headquarters.

2020 – Invited to partake in the Global International Jazz Day concert on 30 April in Cape Town that was cancelled due to Covid19.

2021 – Appointed President of the Portfolio of Creative Industries and Culture for the CTA (Business Federation of Mozambique)

2021- Awarded a COMMENDATION from the Government of Japan for the Promotion of Mutual understanding between Japan and Mozambique

2022 – Invited by the US government to attend and partake in a panel discussion at the US-Africa Leadership Summit in Washington DC in December 2022

2023 – The album SOUNDS OF PEACE won Best International Album at Mzantzi Jazz Awards and Best Rest of Africa Award at South African Music Awards (SAMAs)

2024 – Awarded Knight of the Order of Arts and Letters by the French Government for his contribution to the enrichment and promotion of cultural exchange between Mozambique and France.
